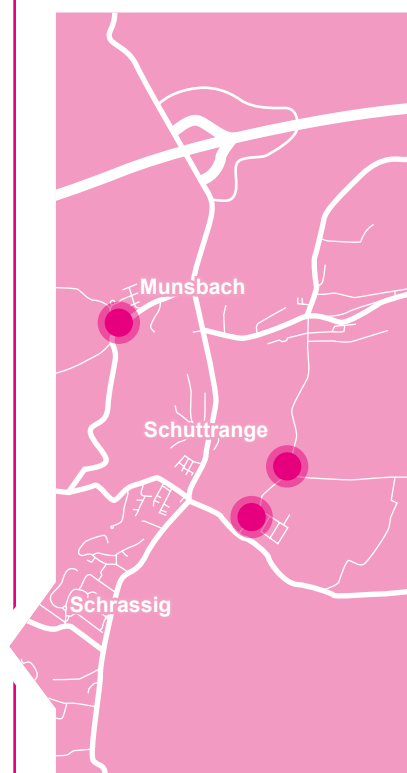

NEW TRAFFIC-CALMING MEASURES

To strengthen road safety and improve the quality of life for residents, three traffic-calming initiatives are planned throughout the commune:

- **Rue du Village:** In this 30 km/h zone, two speed bumps will be installed to encourage drivers to adjust their driving.
- **Am Waasserfeld:** At the entrance to Uebersyren, the existing Berliner cushion will be replaced with a new sinusoidal hump.



- **Rue du Parc:** The speed limit will be reduced from 50km/h to 30km/h. Additionally, the entrance to the area will be redesigned, and the pedestrian crossing is being adapted to PMR (persons with reduced mobility) standards to meet accessibility standards, ensuring easier and safer access for all.

These measures aim to make the street environment safer, more welcoming and inclusive for everyone.



NEW SCOUT CHALET IN SCHUTTRANGE

A modern new facility designed to meet the needs of younger generations will soon be built in the orchard behind the existing communal building. The scout chalet will blend seamlessly into the rural landscape and connect to the new communal building through two access points: a spacious shared terrace and an underground passage.

Adaptable spaces for every purpose

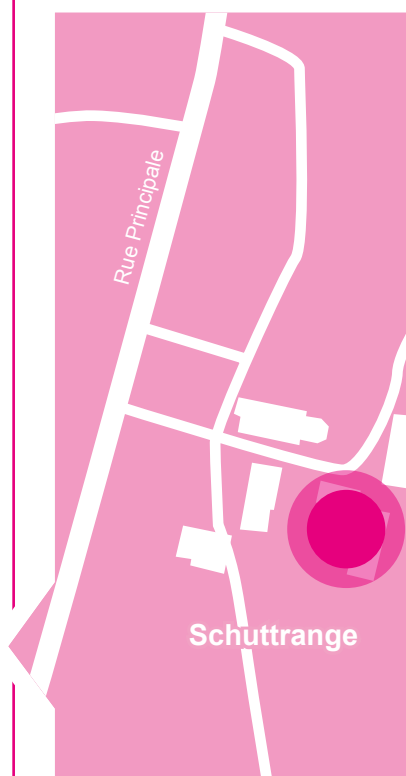
Flexibility is at the heart of this project: each area can function independently, and access

to the terrace can be adjusted depending on the activity. The chalet will not only serve the scouts, but will also be available to local associations, the Maison Relais and the school for a variety of uses.

The lower level, which includes the main entrance to the scout chalet, will feature a spacious 150m² multipurpose room. Designed to adapt to different needs, it can be divided into up to three smaller rooms. This floor will also include a workshop and dedicated storage areas.

Large south-facing windows will allow natural light to fill the space and provide a scenic view of the garden.

Comfortable accommodation for all

The upper floor of the chalet will feature spacious dormitories designed to provide young visitors with a welcoming and comfortable environment. The building will offer approximately 70 beds, several of which will be adapted for individuals with disabilities. Two additional dormitories will be reserved for supervisors. Sanitary facilities have been strategically positioned to ensure effective sound insulation between the rooms and the nearby railway line.

On the top floor, a dedicated rest area, technical rooms and extra storage space will complete the facility.

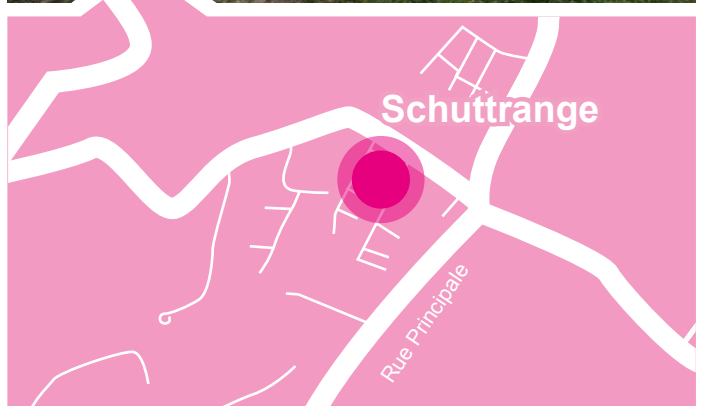
With this chalet, Schuttrange is creating a new community space where functional archi-

tecture meets intercultural living together.

Construction is set to begin in April 2026, with an estimated project cost of €9,113,402 incl. VAT.

“GIELT BAND” INITIATIVE: PICKING FRUIT TO PREVENT WASTE

Over the summer, the commune of Schuttrange once again highlighted the “Gielt Band” initiative, launched to reduce food waste. Residents were invited to freely harvest fruit from trees marked with a yellow ribbon throughout the commune. In total, 13 trees were made available —10 in the Schlassgewan (rue Principale and rue d'Oetrange) and 3 in the orchard near the “Kierchepad”.

The initiative not only raised awareness about food waste but also encouraged the use of fresh, seasonal fruit for homemade compotes, jams, pies and juices. The initiative was warmly welcomed, and we hope that many people will continue to take advantage of this initiative in the future.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL KIT 2025/2026

As part of its commitment to the Climate Pact, the “Klimabündnis” (Climate Alliance) and Fairtrade standards, the commune of Schuttrange actively promotes sustainable purchasing. Since the 2021/2022 school year, every student from Cycle 1 to 4 has received

a back-to-school kit containing eco-friendly school supplies. These items are certified by trusted sustainability labels, ensuring they are environmentally responsible and free from harmful substances that could affect children's health.





Mouer a Wiss

Bonus for ecosystem services provided by wetlands and grasslands rich in species

The Klimabonus Mouer a Wiss programme run by the Ministry of the Environment, Climate and Biodiversity offers a bonus to private landowners whose land contains protected grasslands or wetlands. This programme aims to strengthen the resilience of ecosystems to climate change by encouraging sustainable management of the targeted biotopes.

Who is the bonus intended for?

Any private owner of grasslands or wetlands listed in the open environment biotope register and located in a green zone is eligible for the subsidy, subject to a ten-year commitment to preserve or improve them. To check whether your plot includes an eligible biotope, visit geoportail.lu.

The amount of the subsidy depends on the eligible area and is paid annually by the State:

€150/ha/year for 0–25 ha
 €75/ha/year for 25–50 ha
 €37.5/ha/year for more than 50 ha

A surcharge of 25 to 100 €/ha/year is applicable for areas located in protected zones.

THE LITTLE OWL AND ORCHARDS

For years, the municipalities of the SIAS syndicate, including Schuttrange, have been committed to preserving the flora and fauna of eastern Luxembourg. One positive example is the little owl. This smallest species of owl in Luxembourg used to be widespread in Luxembourg, but today this synanthropic species has become quite rare.

While there were still several thousand pairs of little owls throughout the country in the 1970s, by 2019 only 20 to 30 pairs remained, mainly due to the rarity of its preferred habitat, such as traditional orchards.

The little owl nests in old tree hollows but readily accepts artificial nesting tubes too.

To preserve and improve the little owl's habitat, the SIAS syndicate is committed to preserving existing orchards and creating new ones in its member municipalities. Over the past five years, more than 8,000 fruit trees have been planted in the SIAS area. At the same time, old tree populations are regular-

ly maintained. Through the so-called 'biodiversity programme', the SIAS Biological Station can enter into management contracts with farmers to ensure the orchards are grazed extensively.

Thanks to these and many other measures, the little owl population in the SIAS area is showing a positive trend. It also seems to be feeling at home again in the municipality of Schuttrange.

A POLITICIAN WITH FUEL IN HIS VEINS

Jean-Pierre Kauffmann • Honorary mayor of the commune of Schuttrange

For more than forty years, Jean-Pierre Kauffmann played a key role in shaping the commune of Schuttrange, serving as councilor, alderman and mayor. His political journey began in the early 1980s, sparked by a simple observation: the local football field lacked basic infrastructure — no lighting, no facilities for the players. Determined to make a change, he approached the mayor. What began as a straightforward question soon grew into a concrete idea, and that idea led to a decision: to get involved in local politics.

As a native of Schuttrange, he quickly understood one thing: “If you take part, you can make a difference.” That same year, he stood for election and was elected to the communal council.

“The industrial zone was a great personal satisfaction for me”

As a politician, Jean-Pierre Kauffmann played a central role in numerous major decisions that continue to develop the commune of Schuttrange. One of the most significant was the creation of the industrial zone

in Munsbach. From the outset, it was clear that the project would bring substantial benefits to the commune, recalls the 82-year-old retiree.

Despite legal opposition from some farmers and the sensitive issue of expropriations, Kauffmann remained firmly committed to the project. “As a liberal, expropriating someone is a bitter decision. But it was worth it”, he emphasises.





The industrial zone laid the foundation for the commune's financial stability — a solid base that enabled key investments and supported long-term development.

Today, thousands of people work in the “Parc d'activités Syrdall”. The industrial zone represents more than just economic growth, it is a symbol of innovation. In fact, Schuttrange was the first commune in the country to implement a green roofing policy, a measure with both ecological and practical benefits.

Jean-Pierre Kauffmann also played a key role

in two major infrastructure projects: the school campus “an der Dällt” and the first social housing development in Uebersyren. These initiatives reflect his political vision of a forward-thinking commune, committed to providing affordable housing for all generations and creating educational facilities that meet the pedagogical, social and technological demands of modern education.

Jean-Pierre Kauffmann's political approach has always been guided by dialogue and compromise. “I never pursued anything I wasn't fully

convinced of”, he says. That's why he encourages young people interested in politics to stay true to themselves and fight for what they believe in.

As for disagreements within the communal council, he sees them as a strength rather than a setback: “Life is richer when different ideas come to the table. I think that's a good thing. Of course, sometimes you have to push through, and you won't win every time.”



“Associations are the heartbeat of a village”

For Jean-Pierre Kauffmann, known to most simply as Jemp, his dedication to local clubs has always been a passion. Over the years, he's thrown himself into a wide range of associations, serving as founder, president, vice-president, coach or simply as an active member. He created and ran the “Schëtter Jugendhaus” for ten years, offering young people a space to connect, even those not part of a club or attending school outside the commune. He was also involved in the early days of the tennis club and has remained

committed to FC Munsbach for over sixty years. His dedication extends far beyond the sports field: he serves on the committee of Motor Union Luxembourg, where he was president for 13 years, sits on the board of the Amicale des Anciens Artilleurs and represents the commune at both the CIPA and the Senior Club. He also actively participates in the activities of La Pétanque Schuttrange.

For Jemp, it's simple: community life is the soul of a village. It brings people together, builds solidarity and creates moments that strengthen the social fabric. Sadly, he's noticed a decline in volunteer motivation. That's why he believes it's more

important than ever for the commune to stand behind its associations, offering material and logistical support to keep them alive.

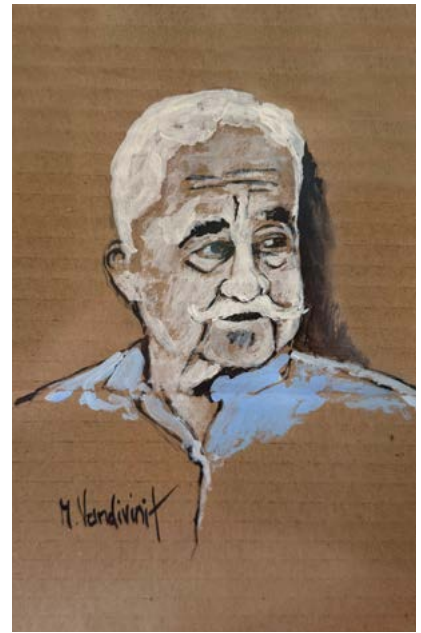
Outside of politics and community work, Jemp developed a deep passion for motocross. He travelled abroad more than 200 times to attend world championship races, holding an international license and serving as a jury member. The travel, the inspections, the organisation — it was intense, but also an incredibly rewarding chapter, says the retired postman.

And here's something few people know: Jemp has a special admiration for one particular artist: Johnny Cash. He fondly remembers a moment in the church in Schuttrange when, out of nowhere, “Ring of Fire” and “Forever Young” began to play. “It echoed through the church like nothing else! And the people were thrilled, absolutely thrilled!”

In June 2025, Jean-Pierre Kauffmann stepped down from the communal council after 43 years of service. Naturally, one might ask: does he miss being a councilor? "I may no longer be a part of it, but I'm still there! Of course, I miss it, but I made the decision to step away."

Though he no longer holds a seat, the honorary mayor — a title he's carried since September 2025 — remains actively involved in many local events hosted by the commune and local clubs. His connection to Schuttrange is as strong as ever: Rooted in Schuttrange, always will be.



LOCAL AND NATIONAL HISTORY MORE GRIPPING THAN A CRIME THRILLER

Just a stone's throw from the former RAD camp in Schrassig lives Marc Trossen, a retired postal inspector. For him, history is far more than a hobby. It's a life-long passion that began in his childhood. He recalls: "In 1948/49, we moved to Merl into a house that had previously belonged to a collaborator—a member of the SA. Years later, while digging in the garden, I came across an infantry rifle, am-

munition, and Nazi insignia." That discovery sparked Marc's deep interest in historical subjects. In 1980, he moved with his family to Schrassig, a village closely tied to his own family history. Two years later, he helped preserve the local memory of his new hometown by publishing a brochure titled "Schrassig – Geschichte einer Ortschaft".

Between 1997 and 2018, the author published a

series of significant historical works, including the book "Chronik der Pfarrei Schüttringen-Hostert sowie der Höfe Anven und Schittringen", two volumes dedicated to fire intervention systems in Luxembourg, and four volumes containing over 100 eyewitness accounts from the Second World War. His research led to several important discoveries, such as the identification of noble seals belonging to Diederich and Johann von Schittringen, the determination of the date of the first fire pump in Luxembourg City, and the role of Luxembourgish resistance fighters in uncovering the V2 rocket factory in Peenemünde.

Marc has always taken a meticulous approach to writing. Rather than spending his evenings in front of the TV, he preferred diving into research. "Crime series on



TV are always the same, and besides, we didn't even have a television at first", he confides. Beyond writing, he also served as a historical advisor for the Luxembourgish film "Operation Pauly", where his expertise in uniforms, vehicles, and historical details was highly valued. "It has to be 100% accurate!" he insisted. His attention to detail helped ensure the authenticity of every scene and avoid anachronisms.

Furniture steeped in history

Antique furniture can be much more than decoration, it can serve as a quiet witness to history. In Marc Trossen's living room, a wardrobe dating back to 1788 stands proudly, rich in character and stories from the past. Although minimalist interiors are popular today, Marc finds joy in furniture that tells a story, pieces passed down through generations. And when the fire crackles in the fireplace on a winter's evening, he sometimes wonders: "If this wardrobe could talk, what tales would it tell?" Sadly, he observes, this kind of cultural appreciation is becoming rare among younger generations.

"You shouldn't believe everything you're told"

Marc's historical work draws on a wide range of sources: archives, eyewitness accounts, photographs, diaries, literature, videos, and even archaeological objects unearthed in his own garden, once the command post of the RAD camp during the Second World War. Critical thinking lies at the heart of his approach. "You shouldn't believe everything you're told. The more sources you consult, the clearer the picture becomes", he insists. Marc doesn't just collect facts; he seeks to uncover connections, reveal family stories, and help people better understand their ancestors' past. Thanks to his publications, several individuals have already discovered where their father was

sent during the war, or under what circumstances their mother was forced to join the "Reichsarbeitsdienst".

Resistance wore many faces

For nearly five years, Marc Trossen served as president of the Union of Luxembourg Resistance Movements, and he remains actively involved on the organization's board to this day. He is deeply committed to preserving collective memory. To him, the story of the Resistance during the Second World War is not simply one of bravery, it's also a story of moral complexity, grey areas and collaboration. In his publications, he aims to capture every aspect of the resistance movement, from organized networks to individual acts of defiance. Many Luxembourgers sheltered draft dodgers, deserters or Jews — people hunted by the





Nazis— or helped them escape to France or Belgium. If caught, they faced prison or even deportation to concentration camps.

While resistance fighters were quickly recognized, those who were forcibly conscripted into the “Wehrmacht” had to wait decades for official recognition. For years, some argued that “if you wore a German uniform, you couldn’t be a resistor.” Yet many of these young men made painful sacrifices to protect their families: choosing to go to the front so their loved ones wouldn’t be displaced, knowing that their grandparents likely wouldn’t survive deportation. To help resolve this controversy, the term “victims of Nazism” was introduced, a recognition that goes

beyond symbolism and marks a meaningful step toward reconciliation.

“We’ve always been stubborn, we never let anyone push us around”

In his brochure “Über Kollaborateure, Mitläufer, Patrioten und Resistenzler – Beitrag zur Geschichte der Gemeinde Schüttringen im Zweiten Weltkrieg”, Marc Trossen highlights the remarkable attitude of the people of Schuttrange during the occupation. What struck him most was their spirit of resistance: they stood up to the “Preisen” as much as they could. In his view, Schuttrange was among the Luxembourgish communes

that most firmly opposed the occupying forces during World War II, much to the frustration of the local Nazi party leader, Batty.



The many examples he gathered in his research, covering the grey areas of local history and surrounding communes, reflect both the complexity of historical events and the importance of preserving and passing on these



a family. What lies forgotten in a box today could become a valuable source for Luxembourg's history tomorrow. That's why he urges fellow citizens: "If you're clearing out your attic, don't throw anything away!"

stories. It's in this spirit that Marc remains actively involved in the Union of Luxembourg Resistance Movements. For this history enthusiast from Schrassig, the Union is far more than just an association, it's a space for engagement, dialogue, and remembrance. With nearly 120 members, including a growing number of young people, the Union takes part in book fairs, exhibitions, and various cultural events. Its mission is clear: to spark interest in history and build bridges between generations.

At 76, Marc sees this work as a vital social responsibility, especially as direct witnesses of that era become increasingly rare.

"Don't throw anything away!"

Local history serves as a powerful bridge between generations. Whether as an author, historical advisor for film or active member of an association, his efforts help preserve Luxembourg's heritage. Marc doesn't just focus on major events, he's equally passionate about the small, personal stories that shape the identity of a village or

EUROPEAN MOBILITY WEEK 2025



Since 2005, Luxembourg has actively participated in the European Mobility Week, which takes place each year from September 16 to 22. The 2025 edition, held under the slogan “Mobility for All”, focused on promoting safe, accessible, and affordable transport for all citizens.

This year, the commune of Schuttrange took part in the initiative for the 16th time, sharing information on the topic of sustainable mobility via social media and organising two activities:

September 16: Inauguration of the Flex station at church square in Schuttrange

To encourage carsharing, several temporary Flex stations were installed in key locations across the commune. Following a six-month trial period, an agreement was signed with CFL Mobility to permanently allocate two parking spaces at the church square for this service. Flex provides subscrip-





tion options designed to meet the needs of both private users and business clients. With a fleet of nearly 250 vehicles available at over 80 stations across the country, it has established itself as Luxembourg's leading carsharing service.

September 22: A sweet thank-you gesture for public transport users

To mark the final day of European Mobility Week, early

morning commuters were greeted with a small surprise: Fairtrade pastries and fresh fruit were handed out to public transport users. This initiative aimed to thank them for choosing sustainable mobility in their everyday lives.

Overall, the 2025 European Mobility Week was an excellent opportunity to learn more about mobility issues and adopt new, sustainable habits. Every-

one can contribute to making mobility more environmentally friendly. Even small changes can have a big impact in the long run.

Residents from both communes gathered on the “an der Dällt” campus, which had been transformed into a lively venue filled with activities for all ages.

The festivities began with an official ceremony, accompanied by musical performances from the choir “Eintracht 1906 Siegelsbach e.V.”, “Schëtter Gesank” and “Schëtter Musek”. Afterwards, guests were invited to explore the Food Village, a culinary journey around the world featuring traditional Luxembourgish dishes and international specialties, all lovingly prepared by local associations.

Children were treated to a variety of fun activities: Patchwork offered glitter tattoos, and a spectacular bouncy castle, generously provided by Cargolux, was set up on the campus. Measuring 15 by 23 meters, it was not only a visual centrepiece but also a giant playground where kids could let loose for hours.

Later in the evening, Sports Hall 2 came alive with a concert by the cover band 24th Frame, who delivered a mix of popular German and English hits. Their performance brought the festivities to a joyful close, with plenty of dancing and good cheer.

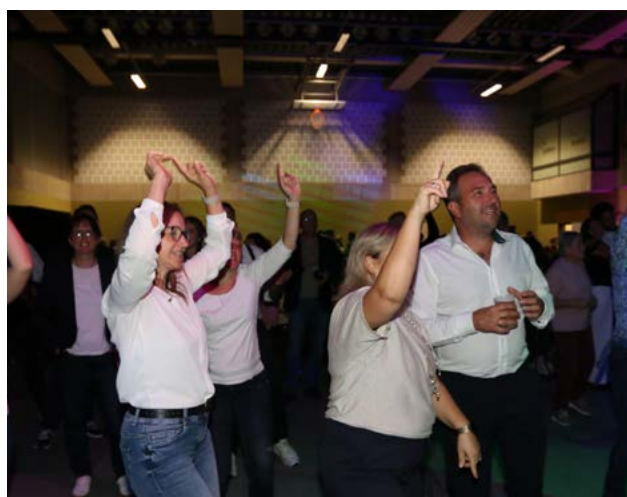
ist Mario Vandivinit, the two pieces are visually linked by the European flag — a powerful symbol of unity, cross-border friendship and European solidarity.

JEAN-PIERRE KAUFFMANN: HONORARY MAYOR OF SCHUTTRANGE AF- TER 43 YEARS OF SERVICE

After more than four decades of dedication to local politics, Jean-Pierre Kauffmann retired from political life in June 2025. On Monday, September 29, a special tribute was paid to him in the presence of Minister for Home Affairs, Léon Gloden: at the age of 82, the Schuttrange native was officially awarded the title of Honorary Mayor.

His political career is remarkable: a member of the communal council since 1981, he served as mayor for over ten years (1998–2005, 2014–2017) and as alderman for sixteen years (1985–1998, 2011–2014).

The honorary title recognizes his outstanding commitment to the community. The official ceremony took place at the Cultural Centre on the “an der Däлт” campus in Munsbach, attended by the col-



lege of mayor and aldermen, members of the communal council, advisory commissions and local associations, communal staff, and representatives of the Democratic Party, all gathered to express their gratitude for this long-standing collaboration.

Mayor Claude MARSON welcomes everyone to the 9th session of the communal council in 2025, which marks the first session after the summer holidays.

The mayor first excuses councillor Andrew KISER, and informs the council that Mr. KISER has given proxy to Mr. Serge EICHER to vote on his behalf.

Furthermore, the mayor announces that the public voting for this session will begin with councillor Jules SAUBER.

The mayor then informs about the events that have taken place since the last communal council meeting:

- On Friday, 11 July, the Parents' Association, in collaboration with the teaching staff, organised the school festival on the Munsbach campus.

On the same day, the Sangria Party hosted by the Youth Club also took place in their cabin behind the town hall;

- On Saturday, 12 July, a new edition of the Schuttrange market was held, where, among other things, the Fairtrade group of the commune organised a Fairtrade product tasting. At the same time, there was also children's entertainment at the "Schëtter Treff";
- Over the weekend, an Icelandic horse tournament took place on Saturday and Sunday at "Bastenhaff" farm in Schrassig. The event was held under the patronage of the commune of Schuttrange;
- On Sunday, 20 July, the Schuttrange Poultry Club organ-

ised an open day followed by a barbecue at their breeding centre;

- The weekend of 25–27 July saw the celebration of “Minsbech On Fire!”, a festive weekend marking the 125th anniversary of the Munsbach-Schuttrange Firefighters’ Association. The programme included a ball at the cultural centre, an exhibition of historic vehicles and firefighting equipment, and a demonstration by the CIS Niederanven-Schuttrange;
- On Sunday, 3 August, festivities were also held in Al-Schëtter to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the “A-Schmatten” farm. The programme featured an aperitif concert by the Schëtter Strépp and various activities for young and old;
- 80 years after the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, a commemorative ceremony was held on 6 August in Wiltz to honour the victims of these tragic events. Wiltz is the

first commune in Luxembourg to join the “Mayors for Peace” commemorative association, of which the commune of Schuttrange is also a partner;

- On Sunday, 17 August, the 12th edition of the Jeng Majerus Hike was organised by the Hironnelle cycling club;
- The weekend of 23 August featured the 50th edition of the “Fête de la quetsche”, organised by the Harmonie de Schuttrange. As part of the event, a plum tree was planted on Rue Jeanne Rouff in Munsbach on 23 August in collaboration with the communal council and members of the association. Throughout the week, plum jam was cooked and sold;
- On Saturday, 13 September, the Schuttrange market was held on the church square, and on Sunday, 14 September, the DP section of Schuttrange organised its Scampi Festival at the cultural centre;

- During these two days, FC Munsbach also organised the “Komes Cup” on the football field.

- On Monday, 15 September, the school year began on the school campus, and the music school also officially started its new academic year. The mayor wishes to thank all teachers and educators for the excellent organisation;
- On Tuesday, 16 September, the “Flex” station on the church square was officially inaugurated. The mayor informs that this topic will be revisited later in the session;
- On Saturday, 20 September, the “La Pétanque” club organised a tournament at the Munsbach boulodrome to close the season, while the badminton club held an open day in the sports hall;
- On Sunday, 21 September, the “La Rose en Fête” celebration took place at the rose garden of Munsbach Castle. In

addition to the many stalls, classic culinary specialties were offered;

- Just yesterday, the sports awards ceremony was held at the cultural centre, where over 80 athletes and teams were honoured for their outstanding performances. The mayor wishes to thank the Sports Commission for organising this event.

The mayor then informs about the upcoming events:

- On Saturday, 27 September, the Friendship Festival will take place, celebrating 35 years of partnership between the communes of Schuttrange and Siegelsbach. The festivities will begin at 5 p.m. in the former sports hall on the Munsbach campus. The event will feature musical performances by the Harmonie de Schuttrange, the Schuttrange Choir, and the Eintracht 1906 Choir from Siegelsbach. After the official part, a concert by the cover band "24th Frame" is scheduled;
- On Sunday, 28 September, the parish "Iewescht Syr Saint-Esprit" invites young and old to its rally event. After the mass at Hostert church, a communal meal is planned, followed by a 5 km rally through the village, starting at 1 p.m.;
- On Monday, 29 September, in the presence of the Minister of Home Affairs, Leon Gloden, Jean-Pierre Kauffmann will be honoured for his political commitment and retirement from political life. The event will take place at 4 p.m. at the Munsbach cultural centre;
- On Saturday, 4 October, a babysitting training course will be held in the gallery of the Munsbach campus. The training will be conducted in Luxembourgish and costs €25. Anyone aged 15 and over may register;
- On Sunday, 5 October, a second-hand market for children's items will take place in the cultural centre during the morning. Registration is open until 1 October with the organiser "Déi Gréng", who offers free table reservations;
- On Saturday, 11 October, the Schuttrange market will be held on the church square starting at 9 a.m., and in the evening at 7:30 p.m., the FC Munsbach football club will host the 3rd edition of its quiz night at the cultural centre;
- On Sunday, 12 October, the Schuttrange Badminton Club will organise the "National Junior Tournament" in the sports hall;
- On Tuesday, 14 October, the commune, in collaboration with ASTI, will host a citizen workshop in the evening at the cultural centre. The commune of Schuttrange is home to 94 different nationalities, representing an exceptional level of diversity. This diversity is a strength, but also a challenge. The communal council invites all citizens to contribute to strengthening integration and improving social cohesion. Topics to be discussed include:

- How can integration be facilitated through the Luxembourgish language?
- What is the impact of volunteering?
- How can citizens be better informed?
- How can local associations contribute to integration?
- On Friday, October 17, a Luxembourgish film about the Second World War will be screened at the Cultural Center at 7:30 p.m. "Operation Pauly" recounts the dramatic escape of four prisoners, including two Luxembourgers, from a satellite camp of KZ Buchenwald. It is not fiction, but a harsh reality, based on numerous documents, testimonies, photos, and archives from KZ Buchenwald and the Arolsen satellite camp, offering an accurate portrayal of the events and the suicidal mission that led to their escape from the Nazis;
- The following day, 18 October, marks the National Day of Commemoration of the Resistance of the Luxembourgish People during the 1940–1945 occupation. The programme includes:
 - At 5 p.m., Marc Trossen's brochure "Grauzonen" will be presented, offering insights into the resistance during WWII and new findings on the RAD camp in Schrassig. Additionally, a small exhibition showcasing objects from the Second World War will take place. Many of these items were found near the former RAD camp in Schrassig.
 - At 6:30 p.m., a commemorative mass in honour of those who sacrificed their lives for our freedom;
 - Around 6:45 p.m., an official speech, followed by a wreath-laying ceremony at the war memorial by the college of mayor and aldermen.
- On Sunday, 19 October, the Cultural Commission will organise a cultural visit to the City of Science and the blast furnace in Esch-Belval. The visit will be free of charge for all citizens;
- On Thursday, 23 October at 6:30 p.m., a conference by Robert Leven will be held at the Sandweiler cultural centre on the topic: "Climate Change & Fake News – Don't give conspiracy theories a chance and learn how to protect yourself against disinformation.";
- On Saturday, 25 October, the Schuttrange Parents' Association will host a Halloween party at the cultural centre from 2 p.m. to 6 p.m., featuring various activities and a children's disco;
- On Sunday, 26 October, the Luxembourg Allergy Network will organise a Halloween ball for children with allergies;
- On Tuesday, 28 October, a forum on protection and prevention will be held

in the evening at the cultural centre. The Police and the non-profit organisation GoldenMe will provide important advice on how to better protect oneself and one's family. Topics will include:

- How to protect against burglaries?
- What to do in case of a home burglary?
- How to protect against online scams?
- Who to contact in case of fraud?

Afterwards, the mayor also provided information on the following topics:

- In accordance with the circular of 16 January 2025 regarding the 4th Water Management Plan, the commune of Schuttrange was invited to submit its observations and opinion. Relying on the expertise of the SIDEEST syndicate, the commune adopts the opinion and the demands expressed by SIDEEST;

- The commune received numerous complaints regarding the risk of falling branches compromising safety along the forest path leading to Wäissebierg. To address the issue promptly, the commune contacted the forest ranger. As the forest is privately owned, it was decided to approach the various landowners to organise a joint tree-cutting operation by a specialised company. In the meantime, warning signs about the risk of falling branches were installed along the path;

- Starting from the week of 29 September, the commune's first courses will begin. The mayor informs that a few places are still available, both for Luxembourgish language courses and for certain sports classes. All information is available on the commune's website under the "Education" section;

- Within the school committee, Ms. Anne Ruppert (Cycle 1) has resigned as a member, effective 15

September. Following this, during the teachers' plenary meeting on 12 September, it was decided by majority vote to set the number of committee members to five as of 15 September. The current committee is composed of:

- Ms. Laura CORTOLEZZIS (Cycle 1)
- Ms. Sophie SUNNEN (Cycle 2)
- Ms. Nathalie HELLERS (Cycle 3)
- Ms. Carole WAUTERS (Cycle 4)
- Ms. Joëlle MAX (President)

- The next communal bulletin is currently being printed and will be available soon. The mayor adds that the bulletin will feature a new, more modern and structured layout, making it easier for readers to find information quickly;

- Regarding the recent floods, the mayor informs that it is now possible to monitor the water level of the Syre in real time

on the commune's website. This is a valuable tool for both affected residents and communal services, enabling quicker responses at the start and end of alert phases.

Alderwoman Conny NEY reports on the following:

- The price adjustment for the "Meals on Wheels" service provided by SERVI-OR, effective 1 January 2026. The meal price will increase from €12.94 to €13.96, and the delivery fee from €5.82 to €6.42. This increase is due to the rising cost of food and personnel expenses. The alderwoman adds that clients of the service within the commune will be informed of the price adjustment with the next invoice.

1. POLITICAL AFFAIRS

1.1. Granting the title of "Honorary Mayor of the commune of Schuttrange" to Mr Jean-Pierre Kauffmann

Mr Jean-Pierre Kauffmann has played a sig-

nificant role in the political life of the commune of Schuttrange for over 43 years, from 1 January 1982 to 26 June 2025:

- Councillor for 16 years and 8 months
- Alderman for 16 years and 6 months
- Mayor for 10 years and 4 months

In accordance with the criteria established by the communal council, the honorary title of mayor may be awarded to individuals who have held this position for at least ten years, or for six years while also having held other significant communal mandates.

Therefore, the communal council, upon the proposal of the college of mayor and aldermen, unanimously decides to award the title of "Honorary Mayor of the commune of Schuttrange" to Mr Jean-Pierre Kauffmann, in recognition of his dedication and contributions to the political and associative life of the commune.

2. URBAN PLANNING AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT

2.1. Special Development Plan for the new district "In der Acht Nord" in Schuttrange

2.1.1. Approval of the agreement for the free transfer of land located in Schuttrange, at the site known as "Ännert der Haart"

In connection with item 2.1.2 regarding the adoption of the Special Development Plan (PAP) "In der Acht Nord", and as part of a reorganisation of parking and traffic on the affected street, it was agreed that the developer would transfer an additional parking space to the commune free of charge.

The communal council unanimously approves the agreement for the free transfer, signed on 10 September 2025 between the college of mayor and aldermen and the public limited company Felino, by which the latter transfers the following parcel to the commune of Schuttrange:

The land acquisition is made for public utility purposes, namely the integration of the parcel into the public domain.

2.1.2. Adoption of the Special Development Plan “In der Acht Nord” in Schuttrange

The project concerns several plots located in the “In der Acht Nord” sector, registered in the communal cadastre (section A, numbers 46/4886, 46/3886, 46/4888, 46/4711, 46/4712, 46/4713, part of 48/3835, and 56/4891). With a total area of 22.92 ares, these plots are located in zone HAB-1 and are overlaid by a zone subject to a Special Development Plan for a new district, as part of the General Development Plan (PAG) of the commune of Schuttrange.

The project aims to develop lots for the construction of four terraced single-family homes, harmoniously integrated into the existing urban fabric.

As part of the project, the commune exchanged land with the developer to facilitate the organisation of the new district and the development of the road infrastructure. Since the land is fully serviced, no additional servicing work or urban planning measures are required.

The communal council unanimously decides to adopt the Special Development Plan for the new district “In der Acht Nord”, and to waive any transfer of land reserved for roads and public facilities, as well as any compensatory indemnity, in accordance with the law on communal development.

Details are available on the commune's website.

2.2. Approval of a targeted amendment to the written part of the Special Development Plan “Hinter Thommes” in Schuttrange

The communal council unanimously approves the targeted amendment to the approved Special Development Plan “Hinter Thommes”, concerning the written part of the PAP.

This adjustment is mainly due to the fact that certain provisions — notably Article 10 on solar panels — were considered too restrictive in light of current practices and recent ministerial guidelines.

2.3. Approval of a targeted amendment to the General Development Plan of the Commune of Schuttrange regarding the reclassification of a parcel located in Munsbach, at the site known as “Auf dem Langenfeld”, into BEP zone

The communal council unanimously approves the targeted amendment to the General Development Plan (PAG) concerning cadastral parcel no. 1195/4357, located at “Auf dem Langenfeld” in Munsbach.

This amendment proposes to reclassify the parcel, currently in residential zone 1 (HAB-1),

into a zone for buildings and public facilities (BEP). This change will allow for the expansion of the adjacent BEP zone, which includes the future extension of the school campus.

2.4. Approval of a targeted amendment to the Special Development Plan for the existing district at “Auf dem Langenfeld” in Munsbach

The communal council also unanimously approves the targeted amendment to the Special Development Plan for the existing district “Langenfeld”, concerning the graphic part of the plan.

This amendment proposes to reclassify cadastral parcel no. 1195/4357, located at “Auf dem Langenfeld”, into a zone for buildings and public facilities (BEP). The purpose of this adjustment is to ensure consistency between the Special Development Plan and the General Development Plan, and to align the parcel’s classification with the already approved amendment to the PAG.

3. NOISE ACTION PLAN PROJECTS

3.1. Opinion on the draft noise action plans for major roads, major railways, and Luxembourg Airport

The commune of Schuttrange is directly affected by three of the five draft noise action plans, namely:

- The noise action plan for road traffic;
- The noise action plan for rail traffic;
- The noise action plan for air traffic.

The communal council’s observations and contributions can be summarised as follows:

Road traffic

The commune highlights several concerns related to road traffic. It requests the installation of noise barriers along the A1, particularly in Munsbach and on the bridge crossing the Syre valley. It also wishes to promote soft mobility and public transport by developing new cycle paths and connections to the “Héienhaff” transport hub.

Additionally, the commune proposes extending the speed limit on the bridge beyond the duration of the current roadworks. It also emphasises the importance of strengthening speed and vehicle compliance checks and continuing the implementation of reduced speed zones (Zone 30).

Rail traffic

Regarding rail traffic, the commune insists that the localities of Schuttrange receive special attention, despite their removal from the priority classification on the noise mapping.

It suggests the installation of noise barriers along railway lines near residential areas, recommends the replacement of old freight trains with quieter equipment, and calls for restrictions on nighttime freight traffic.

Air traffic

Concerning air traffic, the commune notes an increase in noise pollution linked to Luxembourg Airport, particularly due to night flights and holding patterns over the communal

territory. It encourages the implementation of stricter measures, such as regulation of night flights, compliance with flight corridors, monitoring of flight paths and promotion of electric-powered aircraft.

The commune also requests the systematic implementation of a flight path bypassing the village of Uebersyren, while ensuring strict adherence to the recommendations in the charter for sport aviation.

Finally, it calls for a revision of visual flight rules to allow for the construction of wind turbines within the communal territory.

Conclusion

The communal council congratulates the government for organising the public consultation process, taking certain observations into account, and implementing source-based noise reduction measures.

It stresses the need for close cooperation between the State and the commune to ensure the effectiveness of the measures and the quality of life for residents, and requests updat-

ed measurements and studies to assess the real impact of the action plans.

The full and detailed opinion is available on the commune's website.

4. COMMUNAL FINANCES

4.1. Approval of the budget modification table for the 2025 financial year

The budget modifications proposed by the college of mayor and aldermen amount to €115,000.00 in ordinary expenditures.

The communal council unanimously decides to approve the budget modification table for the 2025 financial year.

5. NOTARIAL ACTS, AGREEMENTS, AND RIGHT OF PRE-EMPTION

5.1. Approval of a deed of sale concerning land located in Neuhaeusgen, at the site known as “Auf dem Bartelsberg”

The communal council unanimously approves

the deed of sale signed on 4 July 2025 before Maître Patrick Serres, notary residing in Remich, by which the commune of Schuttrange acquired the land for a price of €105,480.00, as follows:

The acquisition was made for public utility purposes, specifically for the construction of a drinking water reservoir.

5.2. Approval of a deed of free transfer concerning land located in Neuhaeusgen, Rue de Senningen

The communal council unanimously approves the deed of free transfer of sidewalk land, signed on 11 September 2025 before Maître Josiane Pauly, notary residing in Niederanven, concerning the following parcel:

5.3. Approval of a thirty-year prescription deed concerning a path in Uebersyren, at the site known as “Auf dem Rohtert”

Considering that the land in question constitutes an access path and falls under communal road infrastructure, the commune of Schuttrange has maintained it for over thirty consecutive years on the following parcel.

The communal council unanimously approves the deed dated 17 September 2025, signed before Maître Patrick Serres, notary residing in Remich:

6. COMMUNAL INFRASTRUCTURE

6.1. Approval of plans and cost estimates for the development of a pedestrian path in Uebersyren, at the site known as “Am Pratel”

To connect the “An den Azéngen” and “Am Pratel” housing developments in Uebersyren, the college of mayor and aldermen commissioned the engineering consultancy INCA to prepare a cost estimate and plans for the development of a pedestrian path.

After reviewing the explanations provided by the college of mayor and aldermen, the communal council unanimously approves the project prepared by INCA, with a total rounded cost of €191,000 including VAT.

6.2. Implementation of FLEX stations and CFL Mobility carsharing services

Under this item, the communal council is asked to approve two contracts related to cooperation with CFL Mobility:

6.2.1. Contract for the provision of FLEX vehicles and FLEX stations, accessible to all CFL Mobility clients within the territory of the commune of Schuttrange

The commune will provide two parking spaces located in Schuttrange, on the church square parking lot. CFL Mobility will supply two rental cars equipped with navigation systems and Bluetooth devices.

The FLEX service will be available 24/7. The commune commits to paying CFL Mobility €1,558.70 per month, excluding VAT.

6.2.2. FLEX carsharing service contract

To optimise mobility for communal staff and promote sustainable management of professional travel, the commune plans to enter a partnership with the FLEX carsharing service.

The dual objective is to reduce costs related to the purchase and maintenance of the communal vehicle fleet, and to promote sustainable mobility by encouraging citizens to use car-sharing solutions.

The communal council unanimously approves both contracts mentioned above.

7. COMMUNAL ADVISORY COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES

7.1. Replacement of members in the communal advisory commissions

Following several resignations within the communal advisory commissions, the communal council unanimously decides to appoint the following individuals:

Additionally, the communal council appoints Mr Serge EICHER as President of the School Commission, replacing Mr Andrew KISER.

7.2. Replacement of the delegate to the “Schëtter Jugendhaus”
